



School Gardening Partnership

We are keen to introduce you to the *Springvale Garden Centre School Gardening Partnership*.

We recognise that each school is at a different place in their gardening journey. We are looking to partner with you to provide the gardening supplies and expertise you need.

Eligibility

The partnership is open to schools (years 1-13) within the Whanganui region.

General Information

The primary goal of the partnership is to offer an introduction to gardening as a life skill for children and young people. Gardening is a way of providing food and a source of recreation with positive benefits to mental health through connecting with the outside environment.

We are keen to partner with your school, providing gardening supplies and expertise to help you teach them about growing vegetables, flowers and other aspects of gardening.

What You Get from the Partnership

As part of the partnership our School Gardening Co-ordinator, Brydie Hamblyn, can visit your school and offer a joint session on an aspect of gardening with your key teacher and students. This could include planting a vegetable garden, growing swan plants, potato growing, strawberry growing and more, based on the level of interest and experience of your students. Some activities can be started indoors such as seed sowing, growing a sunflower in a pot, or beans that students later take home.

If you join the partnership you will receive:

- Free gardening supplies up to the value of \$100 per term
- Contact at least once per term from Brydie
- Help from Brydie on a custom gardening program to suit your school
- 10% discount on all gardening products at Springvale Garden Centre
